## New Mexico House Bill 123

Animal Food Fee for (Pet) Sterilization

Many APAS members actively followed and promoted House Bill 123 (HB 123) as it made its way through the recent legislative session. HB 123, introduced by Representative Carl Trujillo (D, Santa

Fe), would levy fees on commercial dog and cat food products sold in the state. The state's Animal Sheltering Board (ASB) would distribute the funds to help low-income New Mexico residents sterilize their pets.

The proposed fee was \$100 per year per brand name product distributed by large pet food manufac-

turers. Prescription food ordered by a veterinarian, and specialty products from small manufacturers, would be exempt. The Legislative Finance Committee (LFC) estimated the fee would bring in \$830,000 each year. A few percent would be used to support the ASB's administrative costs; the rest would go directly to spay/neuter support. Estimating \$100 per procedure, this money would support sterilization of more than 7,500 pets in low-income New Mexico families.

APAS is very aware that spay/neuter support is a critical need in our state, where so many people live close to the poverty level. For instance, a 2012 study (summarized in the LFC report on HB 123) found that animal shelters and other euthanasia agencies took in 118,000 dogs and cats in 2011. Nearly half of these animals were euthanized that year, primarily because there were not enough homes for them. The

state spent \$27 million on shelters and euthanasia agencies that year—money that could have been usefully spent elsewhere if there had not been so many unwanted dogs and cats.



HB 123 received broad support, but to no avail. Both the *Las Cruces Sun* and the *Carlsbad Current–Argus* ran supportive articles. The *Albuquerque Journal* ran a supportive op-ed piece shortly before the bill's full vote on the house floor, and also included the bill in a list of "critical legislation" shortly before the mid-March

end of the legislative session. Unfortunately, HB 123 did not survive. It was heard and supported by the House Committees on Business and Industry, and Taxation and Revenue. After that it went to the full House of Representatives, where it passed on a 50–17 vote. APAS was pleased to note that Socorro's new Representative, Gail Armstrong (who replaced Don Tripp), voted for the bill. It then went to the Senate, where it was heard and supported by the Senate Public Affairs Committee. Finally, it was forwarded to the Senate Finance Committee, where it languished until the legislative session ended. Thus, it "died in committee."

We hope HB 123 garnered enough momentum and public support to be introduced again in a future legislative session.
